



# NEED HELP PAYING FOR INTERNET SERVICES?

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program run by the Federal Communications Commission program to help families pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet.

## Benefits:

- Up to \$75/month discount for internet services for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- Up to \$100 discount towards a laptop or tablet

## Eligibility:

A household is eligible if one member in the household meets one of the criteria:

- Income that is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines
- Participate in government assistance programs like Medicaid, WIC, SNAP, SSI, Federal Public Housing, Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit, Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program, Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year
- If living on qualifying Tribal lands, you are eligible if you meet the criteria listed above or if you or someone in your household participates in Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Head Start (only households meeting the income qualifying standard), Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations

## TO RECEIVE YOUR BENEFIT

If you already receive the Lifeline benefit, you automatically qualify and don't need to apply, just contact your internet provider
